

Change into/out of work clothes or special equipment	101	58%
Arrive to work early or stay late to perform necessary job functions	147	77%
Travel to work sites (other than normal commute)	39	59%
Attend mandatory trainings or meetings	95	69%
Work through breaks without extra pay	100	N/A
Other unpaid off-the-clock work	71	N/A


